



The Runners up were East Barnet Gr. Soh. with 27 points and St. Albans Gr. Soh, with 25. During this Congress a five section Lightning Tournament was held - a Senior Section won by A.P. Logsdon; an Under-15 section won by G.M. Franks(St. Albans Gr. Soh.); an under-14 section won by G.W. Phillips, (E. Barnet Gr. Soh.); a novices section A won by J.D. Hiscott, Beaumont Sch., St. Albans; & a novices section B won by A.D. Price of Onslow Sch., Hatfield.
