CONGRATULATIONS to D.E. Rumens on his coming 2nd (eventually relegated to third place though a tie) in the World Junior Championship. The Argentine representative was first, Bulgaria 2nd after application of the Sonneborne Berger system which relegated Rumens of Harrow to third place.

MIDDLESEX: The County Champion for 1959 is J.E. Guthrie - his first success in this event who came ahead of J.A. Fuller & M. Blaine. The Middlesex Junior Champion for 1959 is N.J. Argyris of St. Paul's School. The Under-15 Middlesex Championship was won by C. North of Pinner. A 6 Round Swiss held during the first week in September found these two very promising Juniors.

ESSEX: The Essex Championship has been won by R. Payne of Southend-On-Sea ahead of Dr. Fazekas. Not long ago he too was shining in Junior events.

Essex are planning an Inter-Schools Lightning Tournament on Saturday, 31st October at Durning Hall. Thirteen Schools are expected to take part.

The 1959 Essex Junior Champion is K. M. Oliff of Laindon ahead of S. Golding and A.R. Fersht. Oliff also shares the British Boys' Championship as at York he equalled the scores of M. Firth of Lancashire and J. Lawrence of Birmingham. Mr. L.A. Glyde also sends the scores of the two matches which Ilford played recently against Manchester and Liverpool. These are found in detail in the match results later on in this Bulletin.
