

COUNTY NEWS.

KENT: Mr. H. Keeble reports that the new President of the Kent Chess Association is C.N. Yates, Esq. He also sends the results of the various Kent competitions that have been taking place:

The Kent County Cup: Metropolisan Section, Lewisham emerged as winners.

Mid-Kent Section Tunbridge Wells winners. East Kent: Canterbury won.

In the play off between Mid-Kent and East Kent Canterbury won.

Thus the final is between Lewisham and Canterbury and this I am informed will be played next September.

The Lewis Cup open to all Kent was won by Lewisham, the Stevenson Cup Metropolitan Section again wentto Lewisham, Carterbury in the Mid-Kent East-Kent contest took the honours by beating Maidstone 3-2.

BUCKINCHAMSHIRE: Mr. Ruddle, the Junior Chess Organiser for Bucks, says:

In order to stimulate an interest in Chess in schools in the county, the Bucks. County Chess Association has offered a trophy to be competed for annually. EXTRA NEWS ITEMS.

In the account of this event in the last Bulletin I gave the result SUBJECT TO ANY APPEAL.

Surrey appealed against the adjudication result on Board 1 against Glamorgan - which had been given as a win for Glamorgan. Surrey's appeal was successful and the finalised result on that board is a DRAW.

Staffordshire also made two appeals against their adjudicated result on Board 2 against Glamorgan, and on their Board 12 against Surrey. Both these appeals failed and the drawn result on these boards as given last time stands as final.

The effect of these appeals is to rectify the Board Count in which Staffordshire had emerged as 1st with Surrey 2nd.; the finalised result thus is Surrey 1st and Staffordshire 2nd as shown by the emended table given as a result of the appeals:

Full details of this very successful S.C.C.U. are not in my hands but it must be placed on record that the 50 entries in the Stevenson Memorial was a record for the event. The keenness of the competition can be estimated when it is put on record that the Southern Counties Championship winner was not known till the last round had been played and it then had to be decided by application of the Sonneborne. L.W. Barden, D.E. Lloyd, D.J. Mabbs and T.M. Wheateroft all had 6% points. The application of the Sonneborne Berger resolved this in favour of D.E. Lloyd, the Middlesex Chess sociation Secretary, and we offer him our sincere congratulations.
