JUNIOR CHESS ACTIVITIES.

ESSEX: Mr. J.R. Ried the Junior Organiser has resigned from that post he informs me. This will NOT affect the matches to be played at Durning Hall and he is still holding himself responsible for the S.C.C.U. Essox Fixtures still to be played thore. A new Essex Junior Organiser has not yet been appointed but as soon as this is so it will be reported in the Bulletin.

THE 1960/61 SUNDAY TIMES SCHOOLS COMPETITION: The number of schools entering this year is a record and I am pleased to report that the schools in the S.C.C.U. area have contributed in no small.way to this end. It is worth while recording that Winchester College in the 1959/60 season was one of the last four to play in the final pool at the Hotel Rembrandt on Friday and Saturday of July 29th.

The LONDON SECONDARY SCHOOLS LEAGUE: This year a record number of schools have affiliated to the League making more than 40 playing in the Junior and Sonior Leagues. St. Paul's won the Senior Section last season and Tiffin School, Kingston the Junior League. They are not going to find it an easy task to repeat this performance this season.

MIDDLESEX JUNIOR CONGRESS: This annual congress for Middlesex Juniers was held during the first week in September at The Sandgate Hall, Hayes, 40 Seniors took part in the Under-18 Section, and 64 Juniors book part in the Under-15 Section among whom were some half a dozen girls. The Senior Middlesex Boy Champion is Mr. R. Lee of St. Paul's School with his namesake Mr. P.N. Lee of Wembley a close second. In the Junior Soction Macter G.G. Silver of William Ellis School carried off the hencurs with Master N.J. Patterson, ½ point tchind as runner-up.

THE 4961 LONDON BOYS: This tournament, now known as the London Junior Championship is being held at St. Bride's Institute from January 2nd to January 7th under the auspices of the London Chess League. Entry forms are now available for the Under-18 and Under-16 Boys' Sections, and the Under-18, Under-15 and Under-12 Girld' Sections. The effort to run area sections in 6 different areas of London as a. preliminary tournament proved to be incapable of organisation after heroulean efforts by the secretary, Mr. P. Morrish, and these two sections of boys are being invited to a preliminary tournament at St. Bride's a week earlier, the job of selection of 20 from each age group falling to the lot of the county obganisers. This is not ideal but we felt rather than leave a complete gap it would keep some sort of ocntinuity going until a central home for Junior Chess in London can be found, with suitable helpers to run junior tournaments to the extent that present junior trends demand. If any member of a club or school can help us during the week after Christmas will you please let your Editor know as all the help we can get is very much needed. The closing date for entries is November 26th.
