EDITORIAL.

Easter and its Congresses are over. As this Bulletin goes to press Competitors are struggling for premier honours at Bognor and with 6 points out of 6 it looks as if the Yugoslav, Nikolai Karaklaic, is the present favourite. The full score of this congress will be given in the May Bulletin the last of this year's Chess Fare as far as the present season is concerned. The Congress Director, Mr. N. Fishlock-Lomax said one of the most encouraging features of this year's congress was the increased interest in chess shown by the girls though only one woman player entered in the Stevenson Memorial Tournament.

I am sorry to have to report that R.G. Wade has been taken ill with pneumonia whilst competing in a Masters' Tournament in Moscow. This has resulted in his having to withdraw from the forthcoming Capablanca Memorial Tournament in Cuba and all his many friends wish him an early recovery.

Congratulations to Metropolitan Chess Club on retaining their title of London League Champions. To do so they were faced with having to win their very last game in their final match against Finchley with the score at the close of play 5½-5½ leaving the 12th game to be continued and the championship depending upon it. Very rarely can it happen that a championship depends on an adjourned game and it is a great pleasure to report that they pulled it off to retain their title.

As hinted above the May-June number of Chess Fare will be the last number in the present season and I shall appreciate it if I can have any copy for inclusion by the last week-end in May at the latest.

Counties Finals and then went on to win the double by coming first in the Under-18 Inter Counties Finals. No appeals against the results as stated are now anticipated so Essex become the 1962 Under-18 Inter-County Championship for the first time.
