1962-1963 SENIOR NEWS & FURTHER RESULTS.

S.C.C.U. ANNUAL COUNCIL MEETING:

This meeting was held on Saturday, 6th July (the wettest day for several years) but all counties except one were represented. Mr. L.A.J. Glyde of Essex was unanimously elected as President for the coming season and Mr. J.E.C. Grant of Hampshire as Vice-President. It was agreed to make a new appointment of London Match Controller whose duties will be to make all arrangements for matches played at John Lewis' and Mr. H.W.R. Keeble was elected to fill this post. The resignation of Mr. B. Casson as senior grader was received with regret and the meeting recorded the thanks of all counties to Mr. Casson for the work he has done. In his stead Mr. W. Evans of Buckinghamshire was elected as Senior Grader in his stead. The remaining officials with Mr. R. Cassels as Hon. Auditor were re-elected. Additional members elected to the Executive Committee were Messrs. G.W. Henlen (Surrey), D.J. Blackman (Berkshire), and R.C. Hopton Buckinghamshire.

After careful consideration the meeting approved a proposal to increase the Union affiliation fee to 1/- per head.

At the Executive Meeting afterwards Messrs. Grant, Henlen, Lauder & Williams were elected to represent the Union on the Executive Committee of the British Chess Federation and the 16 places on the Council of the Federation allotted to the Union were filled by the election of these four gentlemen together with Messrs. R.W. Berry (Bedfordshire), D.J. Blackman (Berkshire), W. Evans & R.C. Hopton (Buckinghamshire), J.T. Pascoe (Essex), G. Howard Jobbins (Hertfordshire), H.W.R. Keeble (Kent), R.L. Barnett (Middlesex), A. Terrett (Norfolk), S.G.R. Champ (Surrey), J.N. Fishlock-Lomax (Sussex) and F. Wood (Oxfordshire).

Eight County Junior Teams took part - Berkshire (for the first time), Buckinghamshire, Essex, Kent, Middlesex, Oxfordshire, Surrey and Sussex, and Middlesex took the first step towards gaining a triple crown. The result and final placings are below speaking for themselves on the tenseness of the struggle that took place. No less than six games had to be adjudicated. It was delightful to see Sussex give both Middlesex & Surrey something to think about. To come third only  $1\frac{1}{2}$  points behind the winners shows a future potential that will not have to be ignored.

Having won the right to meet the Champion Counties of the other Unions Middlesex proceeded to the second rung in the ladder for Championship fame when they met at Lewis' Yorkshire, the N.C.C.U. champions, Warwickshire, the Midland C.C.U. champions, Glamorgan the champions of the Welsh Union and Gloucestershire the West of England C.U. champions. The following table shows how they fared but it was near thing with Yorkshire & Gloucestershire only ½ point behind. Nine games had to be sent for adjudication and who the winners were was a matter of conjecture until these adjudicated results came through. Luckily there was no further delay with appeals.
