In view of the enquiries that will result from the fact that Franklin and Winser could have tied with Webb for a play off if they had won their outstanding game I had better explain that The Franklin v Yeeles game was ruled void after a fixture dispute and that Winser was expecting a default v Flynn that was apparently not admissable under rule.

SCCU Junior Report 1966/67

This season has shown more than ever the impact of the younger players on Chess in this country, and the South has been in the forefront in the advance. Basman, Hartston, Whiteley and Keene are already considered for any British International team, and will surely try to emulate Peter Lee, and be challenging for the British Championship Title.

Some have doubted that the present 16 - 18 age group are anywhere near the same category, but performances at Bognor have shown that there

are many with this potential - and not confined to the SCCU we would readily admit.

Ray Keene's proteges at Dulwich have recently been eliminated from the Sunday Times tournament by local deadly rivals Trinity (Croydon), who go for the first time to the Semi Final and Final stage. (St Ermins Hotel, Caxton Street, July 28th, 2-6 pm, July 29th 10-30 to 4 pm.) They may be accompanied by Battersea Grammar who have still to play their quarter final round against King Edwards, Birmingham young 2nd team and a 3 point handicap !

Dulwich College won both Senior and Junior SCCU Championships in the persons of Ray Keene and Ronald Johannes, in the absence of some Surrey big guns - though not without serious opposition from Middlesex, Essex and Norfolk junior stars.

A feature of the season has been the continuig emergence of Norfolk to rival the Metropolitan Counties -  $7\frac{1}{2}$  from 12 tieing with Middlesex for third place in the Junior Jamboree, a half point ahead of mighty Surrey. Without emphasising the vagaries of the Jamboree system, it was most unexpected to find Kent (wooden spoonists in the Fleming Trophy 60 board matches between Metropolitan Counties) in first place on receipt of the adjudicated results. However - after an appeal which was upheld, Kent had, sadly, to step dow to Essex with the same 8 points winning on board count. Going forward to the BCF Final, Essex nearly repeated this reversal. With  $8\frac{1}{2}$  points to Lancashires 9, this time the appeal failed. We hope to see the Norfolk Juniors (and Seniors ?) competing in the Senior Jamboree in November. Their advance has been recognised by the granting of a BCF Schools Shield to the Norfolk and Norwich Schools Chess Association - a tribute to the enthusiasm of its Officers among whom a special mention is appropriate for R.Lionel Farthorpe who has just left Norfolk, and now promises to help invigorate the rustic areas of Cambridgeshire and North Bedfordshire, where we hope his efforts may meet with equal success.

Other individual honours among the Juniors were well spread this season. J.N.Sugden, B.J.Denman, and T.W.Hart helped the English Glorney Cup team to success in Paris last August, and Terry Hart went on to Zug - Zurich to play in an U-21 International tourney at the age of 16 only - his position 8th from 12 was highly creditable against such strong opposition.

B.J.Denman (U-18) and A.T.Ludgate shared the BCF U-21 title, and T.D.Baldwin (U-16) and Simon Webb became joint BCF U-18 Champions at Sunderland. T.G.Congdon nearly lifted the U-16 Cup and Robert Bellin shared the U-14 title. I cannot but comment that the glamour of the U-18 title has lately been dimmed by the absence, more by choice than circumstance, of too many of the possible leading contenders, often to play in the U-21 event with the added lure of the place in the next years British Championship.

Terry.C.Fox has been chosen to represent the BCF in a new open invitation International U-18 tournament in Denmark in June, and Terry Baldwin in the U-17 International Tourney at Schilde - Belguim in July. These two will not play in the Glorney Cup in Brecon at the beginning of August, and the SCCU representative chosen are, Simon Webb, Terry Hart and Timothy Congdon of Essex.

To finance the Glorney Cup - painlessly ? - a new agreement, already in force in the MCCU, will, we hope, be ratified by the other 3 English Unions shortly - whereby £1 will be contributed every year for, or from every English County affiated to the BCF, in addition to £2-10-0 from his county, for every representative in the team. This last has already been agreed by the SCCU Council, and I trust that the Executive recommendation to Council that the first amount be met from Union funds, will be approved, removing any undue burden from our several smaller counties. I shall further ask Council to approve our Treasurer making the payment of the second amounts at the same time, recovering them from the counties later in the new season when accounts begin to swell again. No increase in contributions from Union or Counties will be asked for in the alternative years as in 1968 when England are hosts (Plymouth) and in 1970 when we shall probably be going to Holland - at least 6 teams playing on these occasions.

Combined with increased contributions from the players - minimum £5 for four team events, and £7-10-0 for six teams - the steady income from the Unions should mean little fear of not being able to meet commitments in the expensive years.

OBITUARY.

Dr. S. FAZEKAS.

Dr. Stefan Fazekas, one of Britains few international chess masters died on Wednesday, May 3rd, at his home at Buckhurst Hill, Essex.

The first part of his chess Career took place in Czechoslovakia; he was born there in 1898 and it was his achievements in international events in Czechoslovakia before the war that warranted the World Chess Federation granting him the title of International Chess Master in 1953. A second place at the international tournament of Kosice in 1929 was followed by two excellent results the next year, equal third at Prauge and third at Brno.

He came to this country in the late 1930s and once he had aquired British nationality he played with distinction in a number of British championship tournaments culminating by his winning the title at Plymouth in 1957. Though he never managed to repeat this success he was always a formidable adversary and indeed qualified for and played in the most recent British championship at Sunderland last year where he scored four points.

At his best a brilliant attacking player he always gave one the impression of profound enjoyment in the game. Endowed with an almost impish sense of fun, he was rather like a character from one of Bernard Shaw's early plays. He was a highly esteemed medical practitioner and will be missed as much by his patients as by his many friends in the chess world.
