Southern Counties Chess Union

History was made on Saturday 28th September 1968 in London on the South Bank at the Royal Festival Hall when nearly three hundred chess players assembled quietly in the thickly carpeted Meeting Room on the fifth level for the first of what is hoped will be a series of matches lasting many years. It being recognised by all concerned as a special occasion, a commemorative match was arranged between two sides representing (in name at least if not in playing strength) the British Chess Federation and the Southern Counties Chess Union, this in addition to the more serious county matches of the day wherein Surrey met Bucks, Kent met Hants and Middlesex massacred Norfolk.

The players reached the Festival Hall from all points of the compass and at 2.15 p.m. poured out of the quiet lifts (holding forty players at a time) and entered the Meeting Room where their Match Captains were on hand to show them to their boards where sets, clocks, score sheets and board numbers were ready for their use. The serious business of the afternoon was preceded by an opening ceremony when the President of the SCCU, Mr. J. J. Lauder of Wimbledon welcomed the players and visitors to the Festival Hall. He mentioned two distinguished guests who had come to play for the BCF side, the national President, Dr. C. G. Addingley of Yorkshire who was to open the days play, and Mr. George Simmons of Lincs, the Secretary of the BCF. Speaking on behalf of the players Mr. Lauder expressed their thanks to the small but highly talented sub-committee which had negotiated and planned the arrangements for our future use of the Meeting Room for inter-county chess matches. Finally, the President asked Dr Addingley to declare the opening of the proceedings of the day. In reply, Dr Addingley thanked the SCCU for inviting him to join them on this special occasion and congratulated them on obtaining the use of such elegant premises for their inter-county events, and expressed the hope that much useful publicity would result from this enterprising achievement.

After this inspiring start, the county matches got under way and were well contested and many games produced very keen struggles, but Middlesex as expected proved too strong for Norfolk and Surrey soon established a long lead over Bucks. In the third match Hampshire did much better than they had dared to hope against last year's champion county, Kent, to such good effect that at the end of the day the result of the Championship boards depended on one unfinished game sent for adjudication. Meantime, the commemorative match was very close and the final score gave the BCF a win by a single point. Several games were very well fought and on the top board D. B. Pritchard won against J. M. Craddock after a tough game.

At the end of the days play players took stock of their new venue and acclaimed the Meeting Room as the answer to all their demands and the Union officials were very pleased and highly appreciative of the services of the Royal Festival Hall authorities in placing the Room at our disposal. It is hoped that this arrangement will become permanent and greatly add to the prestige of the game and its players.

The Third British ChampionshipSHREWSBURY 1906

This was held from 6th to 18th August at the City Music Rooms, their use being granted free of charge by the Corporation. The Shropshire Capital, despite some fears to the contrary, proved as popular a venue as the seaside resorts of the two previous years. Atkins took his second championship, his only loss being to Shoosmith. C.H.Sherrard, who had tied for second place at Southport, 1905, had died early in 1906 in Cairo, where he was mathematical master at the Koptic School: he had previously held a similar post at the Bath Grammar School.

Regrets were felt that veteran Blackburne could not finish higher, but his prospects disappeared when he lost his first three games. He often seemed to play listlessly and even timidly, avoiding complications, and apparently trying to bring matters to the end game.

The Fourth British Championship.London 1907

The London Chess League organised the Congress in the School of Art at the Crystal Palace. Atkins again had a full point to spare at the finish, with a single loss to A.J. Mackenzie in the first round.

Blackburne probably lost his championship by throwing away to rather obvious draws against Blake and Atkins. But the 'Blackburne touch' was seen in his games against Ward and Holmes. J.H. Blake and E.G. Sergeant made welcome first appearances in the championship.
