INTER-COUNTIES COMPETITIONS 1972/73

After an exhaustive study of the present arrangements for the inter-counties competitions the Council of the Union have approved a complete re-organisation of these events. The new arrangements will become operational next season 1972/73 and there will be four divisions with promotion and relegation between all divisions. Teams will consist of twenty players in the two top divisions and a minimum of twenty in the third and fourth. The initial allocation of teams is as follows:-

First Division: (Championship winner, Shannon Trophy, runner-up Stevenson Trophy, both being nominated for the B.C.F. Championship quarter-final stage) Berks, Cambs, Essex, Herts, Kent, Middlesex, Oxon, Surrey and Sussex.

<u>Second Division</u>: (Montague-Jones Trophy and nomination for B.C.F. Minor Counties semi-final stage - see below) Essex II, Kent II, Middlesex II, Surrey II, Sussex II, Beds, Bucks, Norfolk and Suffolk.

<u>Third Division</u>: (Amboyna Shield) Berks II, Bucks II, Essex III, Herts II, Kent III, Middlesex III, Oxon II and Surrey III.

<u>Fourth Division</u>: (Ebony Shield) Berks III, and IV, Essex IV, Herts III, Kent IV Middlesex IV, Surrey IV and Sussex III.

Amendments to the Tournament Rules will be submitted to the Council at their Annual Meeting in July and draft proposals have already been sent to council members.

Commencing next season 1972/73 the British Chess Federation have decided to Institute a Minor Counties Championship on similar lines to the present County Championship and to which each Union will nominate one team. This event will be open to all minor counties and the second teams of major counties whose first teams are not eligible for this competition. It is not possible for the S.C.C.U. to operate a separate qualifying competition but the Second Division will be used for this purpose in 1972/73 and the counties concerned have been given copies of the B.C.F. Rules covering this competition and have been asked to decide whether or not they will accept nomination if their team wins the Second Division.

It is appreciated that this is not an entirely satisfactory solution of the broblem of finding the best S.C.C.U. nominee, as it only covers five second teams, but it seems probable that the operation of promotion and relegation between second and third divisions will go some way to meet the problem in future seasons, always provided that there is sufficient enthusiasm among our counties for the Minor Counties Competition.

## OBITUARY: J.A.J.Lambert-Gorwyn.

Mr. F.P.E. Green writes: Chess, not just in the South but nationally has suffered a loss with the sudden death of Jim Lambert-Gorwyn. A Sussex farmer all his life, he retired when he was fifty and thereafter gave much of his time and energy to his club, his county and to the B.C.F. He was Match Captain of the Hastings Club and no mean player himself; he died during the la Hastings Congress, one of its dependable officials. Sussex owe him much, since not long after he had "Retired" he found himself at the county A.G.M. when a county Treasurer was being sought; Jim was no accountant, but he was the soul of integrity, and his enthusiasm and energy for two years put the County's finances into good shape. He was pursuaded to take on the Certificate of Merit Scheme for the B.C.F. and in this he secured his wife's interest and participation to such an extent that she is carrying on the scheme. To Mrs. Lambert-Gorwyn go all our sympathy in her loss, and our thanks for stepping into one of the gaps

## JUNIOR CHESS S.C.C.U. Under-18 Inter-county Jamboree 4th March, 1972.

The Controller, Mr. David Blackman reports: The Under-18 Jamboree was played in London and as a precaution against power cuts, the venue was moved at rather short notice from the Royal Scottish Corporation to St. Bride's. Fortunately all the organisers had time to notify their players of the change and all the players except one arrived at the correct venue on time.

The total entry of seven teams for the boys' tournament was rather dissapointing but on the other it was most encouraging to see that both Suffolk and Cambridgeshire took part for the first time for many years. The final results depended on five adjudications and when these were received it transpired that Surrey had scored 9 points, closely followed by Kent on  $8\frac{1}{2}$  and Middlesex with 8. The remaining scores were Essex 7, Berkshire 4, Cambs. 3, and Suffolk  $2\frac{1}{2}$ . Surrey therefore represented the Union in the B.C-F. Final on 25th March.

Five teams contested the Girls' event, Middlesex dropping out on the day before. Surrey, last year's winners, retained the title scoring  $3\frac{1}{2}$  points out of a possible four. Kent were second with  $2\frac{1}{2}$  followed by Berks and Sussex with 2 and Essex with 0. Surrey will play in the B.C.F. Finals against Lancashire, Lincolnshire and Somerset.
