

BOOK LIST: <u>How to Play the End Game</u> by L W Barden pp128 £2.95 Collins. This, the third book in the latest Collins series follows the works by Levy and Keene on the openings and J E Littlewood on the middle game. With 203 diagrams Leonard Barden gives his explanatory analyses in chapters devoted to the recongnised types of end-game, plus two which deal in careful detail with characteristic end-games by former World champions Fischer and Petrosian. The author's chapter on adjudication techniques will provide for thought for every adjudicator who is fortunate enough to read it and will do no harm to any keen Match Captain who has time to study Barden's advice. In its 128 pages are crammed lots of helpful hints for the ordinary match player who should certainly lose fewer endings and possibly win a few more if he can devote a little time to study Leonard Barden's excellent guide lines. A book for every student who needs to improve his end-game expertise.

How Fischer Plays Chess by D N L Levy pp160 £2.95 (Hardback)

60p (Paperback) Collins. This book might be described as an anthology of sixty-six memorable games whose chronological arrangement provides an almost year-by-year commentary on the development of Bobby Fischer's strategy and technique as he progressed to his ultimate status of World Champion. David Levy has presented his readers with annotation in depth on each game, in many cases by a variety of other experts, together with a biographical background of Fischer's tournament achievements, likes and dislikes, not omitting the well-publicised brushes with tournament officialdom. The book ends in 1972 with a brief summary of the World Championship which the author wisely refrains from reporting in detail as all the games at Reykjavik have been published and analysed in full by many chess commentators.

Readers of Chess literature are again indebted to Messrs Collins for two widely differing but very readable books which were on sale on 9th June. I noticed that Levy, in his biographical pages refers to certain tournament organisers, whilst Barden dedicates his book to "Peter Morrish, Stuart Rueben, Eddie Penn, David Eustace and other overworked British chess organisers".

The Folkestone Easter Congress had a record entry of 139 and the Premier event first place was shared by J C Henshaw and P Van der Weide from Holland with  $5\frac{1}{2}/7$  nine players sharing third place. The Major was won by J van der Zanden and second place was shared by J B Sellens, J Wilman, P C Wood and J A Bower with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points. The East Anglian Congress also broke all previous records with 116 competitors over the 11-13 April weekend and prizes totalled £310. In the Premier event B Pribanich and D Wright shared top place with 4/5, the third place being shared by O M Hindle, H D MacPherson and T C Noyce with 32. Premier Reserves first place was shared by R Alley and I S Gladden with 4/5 third place was shared by C E Purdom, J A Speigel and Mrs D Wright. First place in the Major sections were both shared: in the 'A' by D Carpenter, W P Pfeil and P S Vainker with 4/5 and the 'B' split four ways between T Annison, K Morrison, G Plumstead and R R Rathbone each scoring 4/5. The Finor sections were won by R Hughes with 4/5 and C Cumner with 41/5. 26th Ilford Congress over the Spring Bank Holiday weekend totalled 297 competitors of whom 108 played in the Open Championship, won by A J Miles with 6/6. Next came R Bellin, R A Doney, J R Holland and N E Povah with 5/6 each. The prize for highest rated player in the 170-189 group was shared by W A Linton, D C Taylor and I Watson with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  and the under-170 split between M Davis and S Spivak. The under-18 prize went to S Taulbut for his score of 41. 165 players entered the Major event restricted to under-160 grades and the top places were shared by W T Franklin, D R C Lawson and K Warren each of whom scored  $5\frac{1}{2}/6$ . Third and fourth places went to no fewer than eight players, D G Cannan, M J Coogan, P Harbutt, T Pritchard, P F Brown, C C Sherwood, G Beattie and J R Beadle. The last-named took the under-130 grading prize, but a good deal of research is needed to determine the winners of the 140-149 and 130-139 grades and at the time of going to press this has not been resolved. The high standard of efficiency expected from the organisers was well maintained and at the end of the Congress the thanks of the players was expressed in a brief speech by the Union Hon.
