CONGRATULATIONS

The Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences last month announced that the Nobel prize for chemistry has been won jointly by Dr J W Cornforth and Professor V Prelog of Switzerland. It was stated that the award had been made for "an outstanding intellectual achievement" in Dr Cornforth's work on the stereochemistry of enzyme-catalyzed reactions. The Academy conceded that it was difficult to explain Dr Cornforth's achievement in lay terms, because the stereochemistry of enzyme-catalyzed reactions involves three-dimension geometry. We can leave it at that but many chess players will be delighted to offer our congratulations to one of our number who has given great pleasure over a number of years to his opponents and friends in the London League, for Hampstead Chess Club and Middlesex and latterly Sussex in county championship chess.

The Editor would also like to offer his congratulations and best wishes to Mr D M Bond of Camborne, Cornwall, who has been appointed to succeed George Kilmister as Editor of the West of England Chess Union bulletin "Westward Ho!". Here's wishing Mr Bond all the joys of erudite editing!

BOOK LIST Chess for young beginners. W T McLeod and R Mongredien
Collins p65 £1.50

It is perhaps a co-incidence that this book for the youngest chess players comes out during the pre-Christmas search by all parents and relatives for a suitable present for junior. It presents the elements of the game in a setting of abundance of illustrations suitable for the young beginner and leads on to carefully selected examples of the first principles of tactics and strategy. Like chess it has an international flavour in that it is published by Collins in Glasgow and London, its illustrations come from a Paris house and it is printed in Spain! A safe and rewarding buy for any budding chess player this Christmas or even sooner.

UNION INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP 1976.

Mr H Trevor Jones advises that the Individual Championship of the Union will be held, as in previous years, over the Easter weekend at the Southend-on-Sea Congress by permission of Mr J A Speigel, who will control the event. This will again be a six-round 24-player Swiss, the entry fee will be £5. The total prize money £100, with a first prize of £50 the winner being entitled to the Union nomination for the BCF Championship at Portsmouth next August.

Counties are each invited to nominate one player who has played on one of the top boards in a SCCU competition during the past 12 months or who is their current county champion. In the absence of a county nominee, individual players from that county may apply to enter and the Individual Championship Organiser will make a selection from such applicants. Nominations and applications must reach Mr Trevor Jones by 19th December and all applications should quote the SCCU and ELO gradings of the player and a telephone number if possible.
