## BOOK LIST: THE GOIDEN DOZEN Irving Chernev pp $331 £ 5.95$ Oxford

 University PressDescribed as the twelve greatest chess players of all time, the reader may query the author's selection (Capablanca, Alekhine, Lasker, Fischer, Botvinnik, Petrosian, Tal, Smyslov, Spassky, Bronstein, Rubinstein and Nimzowitsch) or the order in which he rates them, but the quality of the games he quotes are beyond dispute. There are 115 games occupying 331 pages, and dating from 1889 to 1971 and each is fully annotated with diagrams a-plenty. This book is produced in the elegant style which we have come to associate with all Oxford Chess Books and the quality of its contents will amply reward a studious reader.
THE FRENCH DEFENCE Gligoric and Uhlmann pp309 £5.00 R.H.M Press
This book with an introduction by Botvinnik and a contribution by Karpov devotes cver 100 pages to the Nimzowitch (Ninawer) variation and nearly 40 to the Tarrasch variation. Over ninety complete games are given in full and exhaustive analysis of many lines are included. A comprehensive study of a well-tried opening which has served many generations of chess players well for a century and a half and is still popular with all ranks of enthusiasts, this book will find a welcome on many bookshelves.
HON TO OP $\mathbb{N}$ A CHESS GARE Evans, Gligoric, Hort, Keres, Larsen, Petrosian and Portisch pp227 £4.50 R.H.M Press
Each of these distinguished masters offers a chapter giving his advice on two or three openings, expounding in some depth the reasons for his, choice the best lines to be followed and the pitfalls to be avoided. Predictably some readers will find familiar lines known of old; others may be critical of some views expressed (Portisch dismisses the Pirc Defence in half a column) but the reader who examines each chapter and
the philosophy stated by the respective writers will probably add to his knowledge of the openings dealt with and enjoy the variety of opinions and the examples analysed in depth.
42nd U.S.S.R CHAPPIONSHIF Leningrad 1974 with notes by the players R.H.F Press pp205 \%4.50.

All 120 games in this Championship are included in this book, many of them annotated by one or other of the players. It is the declared policy of R.H.M Press to publish a new series of tournament books and this is the first of the series. The round by round reports were translated by Bernard Cafferty and edited by David Levy, photographs are by V Galaktinova and David Levy. A permanent record for the collector of chess events and a collection of games including many very excellent examples of modern play.

These three books and the first arrivals of a number of chess books to be published in New York by R.H.M Press, a division of R.H.N Associates of Delaware, Inc. and distributed in this country by Tournament Chess Supplies.

All four books reviewed above are written in descriptive notation, which may be an added commendation, however slight, in the views of the older generation of readers.
