# OBITUARY: Mr J Hakansson (Herts)

We regret to learn from the Hertfordshire Chess Bulletin the death on 10th February at the age of 88 of Mr J Hakansson for many years a member of the Executive and Council of this Union. He first joined the Hoddesdon club in 1922 and was a vice-President of Herts continuously since 1932. He first played for the county in 1929 and served as Match Captain from 1951 until 1958. He was a member of the old City of London Chess Club from 1938 until that club disbanded, and was also in membership of the Enfield and Welwyn Garden City clubs. In 1951 he became President of Hoddesdon, a position he filled with distinction until his death. He will be long remembered for his services to Herts CA and the Hoddesdon CC to each of whom he donated a trophy which bears his name.

#### BRITISH CHESS FEDERATION

A great deal of administrative problems have faced the Federation during the last twelve months and the opinions of the Unions have been sought in two cases.

Firstly, the request of the London League, a founder Constituent Unit, asking that they should become, for registration purposes only, a territorial affiliate. The Union considered this matter, but in view of the effect this would have on Middlesex, declined to support the proposal. Secondly, arising from the creation of Greater Manchester as a county affiliating to the BCF and the Midland CCU, the BCF asked if the Unions would agree to give the Federation any authority to enforce boundary changes where there was no agreement at county and/or Union level. The views of the MCCU were expressed at several BCF meetings and were summarized in the latest issue of their News Letter as follows:-

"This Union confirms that:

(a) Its affiliates are free, either singly, collectively or partially to apply for membership of any other Union, either 'existing or porposed, and if accepted to join such other Union.

(b) It retains sole discretion on receipt of any application for affilation either to accept or reject such application as it sees fit in accordance with article 2 of the MCCU constitution."

This statement was received too late for the Union to include the matter as an item on the agenda of the Annual Council on 12th June, but the Editor had written to the President suggesting that a policy statement might be considered by our Union on the following lines:

"This Union affirms the right of member counties to adjust their boundaries with agreement of their neighbours, and in the event of a dispute the Union would offer advice after arbitration without seeking enforcement powers. In cases where a county in membership of another Union is involved the SCCU would insist that the other Union be kept fully informed of the course of negotiations. In the case of a dispute the SCCU would consult the other Union and, if no agreement could be reached, the BCF, but would not support enforcement of any decision against a member county."

As there was insufficient time for the Executive to examine this suggestion at the June meeting, the Editor was asked to include the proposal in this issue of the Bulletin and ask all counties to write to the Hon. Secretary or the President stating their views and objections (if any).

Such letters should reach the Union official concerned by 24th August to be in time for inclusion on the agenda of the September meeting of the Executive Committee.

## SCCU INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIP 1976

Once again the Championship was held at the Southend-on-Sea Congress and controlled by Mr J A Spiegel, to whom we are indebted for permission to use all the facilities of the Contress. The Organiser on behalf of the Union was Mr H Trevor Jones who collected a very strong entry for this year's title and incidentally produced a grand stand finish for the last round. At the end of Round Five J M Hodgson led with  $4\frac{1}{2}$  points but eventually lost to N E Pavah, who had the White pieces, in the last round. Povah and MacPherson with 4/5 both needed wins in the last round to lead Hodgson and in this both were successful as the final table shows:
