ON THE JUNIOR FRONT

We are pleased to report that the Metropolitan U18 County matches, whose future had seemed in doubt, are going ahead despite the lack of an SCCU Junior Organiser. The four Counties concerned (Essex, Kent, Middlesex and Surrey) have made their own arrangements and the first results of the season appear below, or will if the messenger service functions. Peter Morrish has also gone ahead - fortunately, for no one else seems to have thought of it - with arrangements for the SCCU junior individual championships, incorporated as usual in the Lloyds Bank/BCF Junior Squad events.

There is a snag. We have remarked before that junior organisers are notoriously lone operators, and in this instance they omitted to mention their plans to the Union. (The Bulletin found out more or less by accident.) For the purely Metropolitan events this does not matter a lot; nobody seems quite sure whether they are SCCU events anyway. But there is also the SCCU qualifier for the BCF U18 team championships. The SCCU Executive, having put out feelers in London and got no response, concluded that nothing was going to happen there and accepted Nigel Dennis's offer to lay the event on in his own County. It has been fixed for the 3rd March at Maidenhead, and the Counties have been informed. It now turns out that the Metropolitan people had already fixed their own date in London. The same date, as it happens. They are refusing, on grounds of cost, to travel to Maidenhead, and we understand that Herts feel the same way. No doubt the Executive will tackle this problem at its next meeting later this month.

#### ROUND THE COUNTIES

BUCKS Individual Championship was not held (too few entries for the proposed congress), but the lower divisions proceeded as normal. Division 2 was shared by Steve Kirby (Slough), Andrew Hill (Chesham and Amersham) and Ron Scopes (also Chesham and Amersham). Division 3 went to Jerry Brooks (High Wycombe).

We hear of the death of AA Clery who was County President and Chairman until his retirement to Sussex about 10 years ago. He played regularly for Gerrards Cross, and the County, in the fifties and early sixties.

ESSEX KO went to Wanstead and Woodford who beat Upminster  $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $1\frac{1}{2}$  in the Final. The Wanstead Club, we hear, traditionally has a tandem simul given by the winners of its two main competitions. Though Alan Marshall won them both this year, he roped in a partner and they gave a tandem anyway, winning  $10\frac{1}{2}$ - $7\frac{1}{2}$ . Sounds fun. In one game, one half of the team trapped a Queen only for his partner to overlook the Queen and take a Bishop instead. They won the game.

HERTS: Puller Cup (Club Championship Jamboree) went to St Albans 6/8 from PFRME (we'll find out what those initials stand for one of these days) 5.

KFNT Summer Quick-play Tournament went, for the first time, to a London Club. Lewisham beat Canterbury  $8\frac{1}{2}$ - $7\frac{1}{2}$  in the Final.

NORFOLK: The Norwich Summer League went to Norwich Union All Stars 14 from DONS 11, Norfolk and Norwich "A" 10... 8 teams. The Norfolk Lightning Tournament "didn't even appear. The \*\*\*\* club agreed to stage it, but didn't."

The Roehampton Club (don't know what County they're in) staged a John Nunn simul 29th Oct 1983 and the GM scored +22 =0 -1 (Alan Jeffreys).

And the Insurance Chess Club has, after 90 years of existence, got round to producing a magazine. It's called "ChessIns" and is edited by Ian Hunnable, who also does the Wanstead one.

STRANGE goes on in the first round of the National Club Major (i.e. intermediate) Championship. Bognor travel to Canterbury (about 85 miles as the crow flies). Worthing, a dozen miles along the coast, entertain South of the Thames (55 miles). Seaford, also on the Sussex coast, get Margate (75 miles). Margate is 15 miles from Canterbury. Tunbridge Wells meanwhile, not too far from any of these, are at home to the University of Essex. Avoiding very local pairings is one thing, but there are limits! Essex Univ talk of withdrawing.

rules and laid-down procedures. Failure to do so can incur penalties.

Editor's note: Some of you are very lucky to have an indulgent Tournament Secretary. In the tournaments I run, late adjudication claims (even one day late) just aren't accepted. But with a Bulletin hat on, I'd like to make my own plea: send your results to me for publication! Some of you do, some don't. Some are prompt, some aren't. An asterisk by a County's name in these results means I have received the result from that side. When Kent play Cambs, I have to rely on spirit messages.

Please remember that matches not published here are unlikely to get graded. Please try, also, to give full initials. It may be obvious to you who a player is, but the grader is unlikely to have your local knowledge. When "J Smith" plays, the grader will probably assume it's the J Smith he already knows about; but then again, he may not. Names which are positively incorrect cause the grader real problems. He can probably be relied on to translate "MC Pitt" as "MJ Pitt" if MJ Pitt plays regularly; he will even, with the benefit of two correct initials, recognise "SW Giddus" as SW Giddins. Whether he will recognise "I Portuney" as IM Pountney is less clear; indeed, the Bulletin is only guessing. And no apologies for using Kent examples. If I can't be rude about my own County, who can I be rude about?

Afterthought: the copy deadline is the first of the month of publication. But results arriving in the first week of the month, or even later, will often go in. Don't assume you've missed the boat just because you've missed the official deadline.
