(I think "7½ - -½" would look even more strange!) It was felt that loss of game was insufficient penalty for playing an ineligible player...

Ed: - Why is loss of game insufficient? Is fielding an ineligible player more serious than defaulting? Surely not unless it's deliberate, and you have to assume (don't you?) that it isn't. Or do Surrey work on the principle that half the time you'll get away with it, so you can't object to a double penalty when caught? Yes, know the SCCU rule is similar.

GRADING

Again. You have permission to skip this article if you wish; it is produced for the sole benefit of readers interested in the grading process. They will both be relieved to hear that the Supplementary List, expected in December, is out (ours arrived 29th January). The delay was caused by the need to sort one group of players into alphabetical order; the required program was not available and getting it written took some time. Sorting the list is not a thing the computer likes to do: it isn't really man enough for a job that size. This is why alphabetical order and reference numbers go hand in hand - you don't have to sort the file before printing it out. To delay the time when we run out of gaps between reference numbers, new players don't go into the main list until they've got a "proper" grade; instead they go into a separate section with temporary reference numbers. (Which of course my own programs won't accept, so I've got chunks to re-write...)

I proclaimed last time that I would never learn to call the master list by its sesquipedalian new name. Wrong! It really is a supplementary list. The old master list contained everyone, duplicating the players in the published list as well as throwing in the two-game-a-year merchants. The Supplementary List excludes players in the published list. So the poor old grader, or congress organiser, has to look in two different lists now, hasn't he? Wrong again, it's three. The Supplementary List is in two parts, remember. You can't accuse the new system of being grader-friendly. The BCF is aware of this problem.

The North of England are still missing, but should be in next year. WECU grades for unregistered players are in a separate list, available only to graders, and itself divided into two parts (and that makes five).

I've just noticed the addendum slip in the main list, stuck onto the last sheet but one to fool the unwary. Six.

Both are available from the Grading Administrator, BCF, 9a Grand Parade, St Leonards, East Sussex TN38 ODD. The SCCU list, at least three-quarters the size of the national one, goes down to 18 games in the last two years and is still available (as far as we know!) from Martin Cath - details inside front cover.

Ed: - Sorry about the "!!!!", Paul. It registers my surprise that anyone's still using Sonneborn-Berger. Can you justify a convention that beating a strong player and losing to a weak one is better than losing to the strong one and beating the weak one? I used to think Sum of Progressive Scores was a big improvement on Sum of Opponents' Scores, as indeed it is from a practical point of view, but lately I've come to suspect that SOS gives "fairer" results. Should you split ties at all? Any opinions?

SCCU UNDER 14 JAMBOREE was held at the City of London Boys School 24 Jan 1987. Full results next time, but the final scores over 30 boards were: 1 Middx 44½/60; 2 Surrey 29; 3 Kent 24; 4 Essex 22½. The event was open to non-Metropolitan counties, though none played.

JUNIOR REGISTRATION

It was proposed and agreed, at a recent meeting of the BCF Management Board, that BCF registration should be required for all players in BCF junior events. To find out what this would mean in practice we have spoken to John Tonkin, BCF Director of Junior Chess; and the (slightly confused) situation is as follows.

At the moment the only junior events requiring registration are the BCF championships and the Counties Under 18 team championship (though the rule is not enforced in the latter).\* Exactly which events will be affected by the Board's decision is not yet clear. The rule for the U18 team championship will in future be enforced. Training events laid on by the Federation will certainly be affected, and BCF Junior Squad events may well be. The "Times" schools KO technically has to be as well, though that is not the BCF's intention, and the newspaper has a veto anyway.



Mr Tonkin is concerned that the counties should not feel he is trying to steamroller things through. He had not been able to consult them in advance, but intends to send them full details in the near future and will naturally give due weight to their reactions. The change is provisionally due to take effect from the 1st May 1987, but the decision could obviously be reversed if there turned out to be strong objections. Your Editor has very little idea how many juniors might be affected in the Southern Counties, or what objections there might be.

The change, incidentally, involves a modification of Appendix 2 to the Constitution. Rule 20 provides that a simple majority of Council is sufficient "on a resolution amending the text" of this; but Rule 10 provides that the Management Board can "modify" it anyway. We're not sure where this leaves Council.

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\* Players under 11 are exempted from registration even in these, according to Appendix 2 to the Constitution. Mr Tonkin informs us that the current rule is: "Registration required for under 11s, but they get it free." This is not a distinction without a difference, because they have to register through their counties/unions rather than as direct members, and it's only the BCF bit that's free. We had not heard any of this before, to the best of our recollection, but it seems to be quite an old change that has failed to find its way into the Appendix.

BCF/CEEFAX/CDS SOFTWARE Under 18 Championship - see last issue - is under way. (And will that require registration? Presumably.) Entry was 500+. There are eight regional Swisses, each producing one qualifier for the quarter-finals (where games start to go out on Ceefax). One was held at Basingstoke 24.1.87 (1 AP Summerscale 5½/6; 2 P Rossiter 5; 3 (SPS) M Adams 5...), another was held at Durham on the same day and one had already been held at Cardiff. The rest are at Bedworth 7.2.87, Burnham (Essex) 8.2.87, Bristol ?25.2.87, Liverpool 1.3.87, and somewhere in Scotland. You will have gathered from the Basingstoke results that the entry was strong (though Basingstoke is probably the strongest); also that the favourite is probably out. Players did get to choose their tournament (and may still swap if they've had to miss their original selection). The last three (KO) rounds will be played from players' homes by electronic mail, or even smarter systems, in the Easter week.

ENGLAND-USSR MATCH? Negotiations are "progressing well" towards a 12-board match: each team to have 2 U20s, 2 U18s, 2 U16s, 2 U14s, 2 U12s plus one girl each at U20 and U14; each age group to be a 4-round mini-match. The match would take place in this country in the week before the Lloyds Bank Masters.

Adjudications are a delightful source of disagreement. There's been some comment in news flash lately about the fellow who claims a draw, gets a win, and loses his money. (Came up in the Bulletin a while back, so we won't bore you with a demolition of the BCF's position.) A couple of clubs in a county league have found a new way of disagreeing. Two games were unfinished. It was clear, at the end of the match, that Team A was better in one and worse in the other. Team A there and then suggested a package deal (two draws). Team B said "No, we think we can hold this one and win the other." Or words to a similar effect, and the exact words might be crucial. In private analysis afterwards both sides discovered (of course) that Team B could neither hold the one nor win the other. Team A sent in a claim for one win. Team B protested, "They offered two draws and we are accepting them." The tournament controller agreed with Team B. Any views? Actually, if Team B's response to the offer really began with the word "no" as quoted above, then they obviously rejected the offer and had no case. So assume, for the sake of argument, that they said something non-committal like "Well, we think we've got  $1\frac{1}{2}$  points here. We'll go away and have a look at it." Are on-the-spot package offers, as Team A thought, just a device to save bother, lapsing if not accepted at the time? Would you hold Team A to their offer if you were the tournament controller? Would you hold them to it if you were Team B?
