LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Richard,

14.10.91

Jack Speigel's letter on BCF income/congress affiliation fees is, on the whole, a non-sequitur.

(a) Any congress organiser will have drawn up a budget to cover expenses such as venue hire, postage, prizes etc etc. A fee to the national body is simply a routine item in budgetting if the organisers are halfway competent.

(b) Despite the impression Jack seeks to give, the BCF is not an ogre. Surely to goodness he realises that all the congress has to do, if its budget collapses, is to ask the BCF to waive its fee.

(c) Even in Jack's worst case, 20p a game on a weekend congress is £1.20 "on" the entry fee. I don't believe that weekend events are that price-sensitive. Sensitive to higher travel and overnight costs yes, and sensitive to recession; but not to the fine degree of £1.20.

I would agree that BCF coercive pressure, such as approaching sponsors, would be impudent; but it's not unreasonable for a fee to be sought for a grading service provided. The rest - payment to graders etc - is a matter of detail. And the acid test, of course, is whether players will take part in an ungraded event - so long as they do, the organisers can indeed forget all about the BCF.

ROUND THE COUNTIES

BUCKS results 1990-91: League Div 1 Bourne End (3/8); runners-up Bourne End II(!). Div 2 Royal Grammar School; Div 3 RGS II. No, we don't know where RGS come from, though we suspect it's High Wycombe. We hear that Bourne End also won the second division of the Berkshire league, and Slough (4th in the Bucks first division) are Berks Champions. There will be only two divisions in Bucks this year.

Individual: County Champion is John G Brookes (Bourne End) for the first time; Div 2 AG Brown; Div 3 J Gording, G Pierce, W Baker.

Bucks announce the formation of a Bucks Junior Chess Association.

CHILTERN LEAGUE: Berks U18 8½ 11½ Berks II 21.9.91; Oxon II 11 9 Herts II 21.9.91. The Chiltern counties are Berks, Bucks, Herts and Oxon. Basically it's a second-team competition, but Bucks and Berks field U18 sides as well. We note that the rate of play is now 36 in 1½ then all the rest of your moves in 45 minutes (plus what you had left over from the 90?); except against Oxon who must have been awkward, because with them it's 36 in 1½ plus 18 in 45 plus adjudication. Maybe the Chiltern counties are more advanced than the rest of us in their opposition to adjudication. Including Oxon, since they've accepted 4½-hour sessions. And the best we can do in the SCCU leagues is accelerated finishes in March.

MID SUSSEX LEAGUE: A record 38 teams will compete in the four divisions this season. Newcomers are Worthing; Peacehaven & Telscombe Cliffs; and Hastings who will play all their matches away as a condition of entry. (They're either mad or match-starved in Hastings. William Parker School used to play in the Tunbridge Wells Schools League on the same condition.)

KENT: Summer Quick-play 1991 was won by Hastings(!), last year's runners-up, who took their first title by beating Lewisham convincingly in the final. Actually we do let them have home matches, though we've noticed they're not in Kent. It is rumoured that noises have been made at Hastings about changing their allegiance to Kent. They play in the Mid-Kent (summer) league as well.

There is an annual tournament between players from Folkestone & District and Boulogne & District. This year's event was held (where?) on Sunday 20th October. 50 players participated, 25 from each country. 1 RM Wiltshire 5½/6; 2-3 MR Wiltshire, G Mortimer 5... "The attractive Trophy has during the past five years only been won by Englishmen including Chris Ward. The 1990 winner was M Wiltshire whilst this year's winner was his son Richard Wiltshire with father finishing in second place. Is this record achievement for a father and son entering the same tournament?"

INSURANCE CC: AGM Lightning 26.6.91 and Opening Night Lightning 25.9.91 were both won by Ray Sayers (Bowring). Champions (Bowring) drew 5-5 with the Rest 19.9.91.

KENT bought a County Grading List this year and found that all the junior grades in it were different from those published in the national list. First thought was, the computer's forgotten to apply the junior increment; but that hypothesis didn't seem to work when you looked more closely. The BCF confirmed that something was going wrong with the programs. They didn't know what, but it only seemed to be happening with "complete" lists - the ones that go down to one-game merchants. (Not that Kent had asked for that, but it's what they got.) So the published national and SCCU lists are OK, but one guesses that the graders' Master List - not printed yet - could be at risk. Can we expect delays on that front?

Presumably the problem is connected with the sliding-scale junior increment, since the programs have just been amended to handle that. So with any luck they'll locate the bug easily enough. Probably have already.

Postscript: they have. Master List arrived 6th November, with Kent Juniors (on a quick check) correct. The four missing pages arrived a few days later.

One side said 175, but their adding up was wrong. (The most one-sided individual game went 45-13). Fortunately there was no disagreement about who'd won, though every disagreement about which board was which, what the average ages were and whether Robert's age was really 12 years and 13 months. Presumably they were playing chess. Mind you, funny things happen in football. To quote yesterday's U13 goalkeeper: "I only let two goals in, but we drew 1-0."

On the serious side, Mitchell Taylor who controls the "Times" nationally tells us that in some counties, under the pressures of local management, schools are seeking to charge their own teams for room hire. So the teams don't enter. We can hardly believe this. They haven't tried it down our way yet, and there'll be ructions if they do.

### SCCU COUNTY MATCHES

We forgot to say last time that an asterisk by a county's name means the result has been received from that side. The un-co-operative (or unlucky-with-the-post) will be identified, if only by silence.

And, in pursuance of a disagreement mentioned last time, Paul Watson of Sussex has sent a photocopy of a recent cheque drawn on the account of "Mr RWB Moss" and signed "RWB Moss". Mr Moss told us himself, last season, that it was RBW and people kept getting it wrong. Witnesses confirm this. We were in Maidstone at the time. Does he have one set of initials in Sussex and another in Kent? Is he perhaps a Bunburyist, and if so who is playing Bunbury? Watch your Bulletin for breathtaking revelations. In the meantime we'll play along with it: RWB when he's in Sussex, and RBW in Kent.

#### Substitutes.

Please make sure that substitutes' names get substituted as well as their persons. In two matches this time, one side had left the original names in. I could easily not have spotted this, especially in the case where the correct sheet arrived three weeks after I'd done the typing. Known substitutes are identified by "(r)".

#### Defaults.

Quite a lot of them, and a little problem's been brought to our attention. It's not our practice to identify named players who fail to turn up: we just put "def" and leave it to readers to infer that there will have been a named player if it isn't at the bottom end of the team. Very often, match captains themselves just put "default" and

the Bulletin's as much in the dark as anyone. The problem is, one player (may as well say T Nguyen) turned out for Kent III on the 26th October and simultaneously lost by default for Kent II, as a named member of the team. Obviously, he shouldn't have been named for Kent II and his default - actually on board 12 - should have gone to the bottom end where Kent were defaulting already. So Kent II, however unwittingly, gained an unfair "advantage". Yes, we know the rules don't say "default at the bottom end", but it is the accepted practice.

This isn't an attempt to pillory Kent, though it is the Editor's own county. Accidents happen. And who knows, the same thing may have happened in other counties and you'd never know from the team lists as published in the Bulletin.

Should this sort of thing be policed? In the general case, where a substitute would have been available, a county doesn't gain by defaulting through its own inefficiency. But how would you go about policing it anyway? Require match captains to name their defaulters, and have the names published in the Bulletin so everyone can check? (Remember the Tournament Controller doesn't check, he leaves it to you.) Fine, if all match captains complied. What the grader would think is another matter. Don't know about Mr Cox, but when we're grading and it says "J Smith 1 0 Q Brown def" we never notice the "def" until we've entered the game result. Don't ramble, Haddrell.

The ideal solution, to the real problem, would be for everyone to stop defaulting. Kent defaulted nine other games in those two matches, and they weren't full 20-board matches at that. Kent are the only county to field four teams, and we hope they haven't bitten off more than they can chew.

BCF YEAR BOOK OF CHESS "will shortly be available" (November ChessMoves). Haven't seen it yet (23.11.91); don't know the exact target date. But Kent bemoan the impossibility of getting up-to-date club details into it. Kent clubs tend to hold their AGMs, and change their officers, in September/October, too late for the Year Book deadline. Is it different in other counties? Kent's solution, assuming it's not, would be to delay Year Book publication until (say) January. The YB appears "late" as it is; for the price of another month or so you'd at least get a fairly up-to-date product. Kent intend putting this to the BCF via the SCCU. That'll take months; any comments, in the meantime?

We see they're putting the rules and Constitution back in the Year Book, after a three-year absence. Good idea. Last time we were at a BCF-stage county match, and that doesn't happen often, a small question arose about the rules and no one had a copy. The Year Book yes, but not the separate rules thing. We suspect, on next to no evidence, that the rules thing never sold well.
